Completion of the full CSU or UC IGETC certification (CA), Washington and Oregon state-approved Direct Transfer degrees or other state's equivalent transfer certification prior to the student being admitted, enrolled and attending his/her first session in a bachelor degree program at Brandman satisfies all Brandman University GE requirements except LBSU 302 & 304. Students who matriculate to Brandman with partial GE certifications will have their coursework evaluated on a course by course basis to determine appropriate applicability to each general education category.

Lower division courses may be eligible to fulfill upper division major requirements if approved by the Dean of Arts and Sciences.

This list includes only the requirements that are commonly seen in transfer, and is not a comprehensive list of all the course requirements within the BA Applied Studies program. In addition to the University General Education and elective requirements, BAAS has a foundation requirement of 15 credits and a degree emphasis of 21 credit hours at the upper division level. Students may choose from three concentrations, or select 21 credits of electives. Concentrations available are: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Applied Communication 2. Applied Humanities 3. Leadership 	

While it is possible for transfer coursework to meet course requirements within these emphasis areas, that coursework must be reviewed by an academic dean within the School of Arts & Sciences, to determine transferability.
