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The Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant Program provides federal funds to students who are completing or who plan to complete coursework that is required to begin a career in teaching, and who agree to serve as a full-time, high-need-field teacher in a low-income school for a minimum of four years. If teaching service is not completed within eight years, the grant is converted to a Federal Direct Unsubsidized loan that must be repaid with interest accruing from the date of disbursement. Once the TEACH Grant is converted into a loan, it cannot be converted back to a grant. The TEACH Grant is essentially a loan forgiveness program.

To be eligible for the TEACH Grant, you must meet the following criteria:

- Have a qualifying GPA:
 - Transfer undergraduates must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.25 from all colleges attended.
 - First time graduate students must have a minimum undergraduate cumulative GPA of 3.25 from all colleges attended.
 - Graduate students beyond the first year must have a minimum cumulative 3.25 GPA in graduate coursework.
- Enroll in a qualified Brandman University program (future academic program changes may result in loss of eligibility for the TEACH program)
- Maintain a minimum GPA of 3.25

Steps to Apply for a TEACH Grant:

- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at FAFSA.gov
- Complete initial TEACH Grant Counseling on StudentLoans.gov
- Complete an Agreement to Serve (ATS) on StudentLoans.gov

	I understand that if I am awarded the TEACH Grant it may be necessary to reduce other government funded assistance.
	I understand I must complete TEACH Exit Counseling at StudentLoans.gov when I graduate, withdraw or cease half time enrollment.
