The following graduation information is exhibited for compliance with the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended. Primarily serving adult learners and/or non-traditional students, Brandman University did not enroll any first-time, full-time certificate or degree-seeking undergraduates during the fall term of the 2009/2010 academic year. As such, this graduation report reflects the completion status of undergraduates who may have earned academic credit at another institution prior to starting at Brandman University. 150% within normal time for completion is defined as a six-year graduation rate.
