The following information is a guide of courses that transfer to Brandman University to fulfill general education requirements and Information Technology major requirements in the Competency-Based program.

Completion of the full CSU or UC IGETC certification (CA), Washington and Oregon state-approved Direct Transfer degrees or other state's equivalent transfer certification prior to the student being admitted, enrolled and attending his/her first session in a bachelor degree program at Brandman satisfies all Brandman University GE requirements except competency LBSC 320 & LBSC 321. Students who matriculate to Brandman with partial GE certifications will have their coursework evaluated on a course by course basis to determine appropriate applicability to each general education category.

The Business Administration major includes 34 core competencies. See the catalog for a full list of General Education, Major, and Emphasis competency requirements. Information on transferring prior coursework to meet Brandman competencies can be found in the 2019-2020 catalog.

This list includes only the requirements that are commonly seen in transfer, and is not a comprehensive list of all the course requirements within the BS Competency-Based Information Technology program. For a complete list of program requirements, please refer to the Brandman catalog.
