<p>In addition to the general education requirements, the Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing consists of three components. The first component consists of foundation courses. The second component consists of 36 credits of upper division Nursing CORE requirements. The third component consists of possible elective credits to satisfy the 120 undergraduate credits for the degree.</p>
